Commencement Speaker

Linda L. Singh, Ph.D.



Dr. Linda L. Singh is a distinguished professional with over 35 years of experience in leadership consulting and systems integration. She is the founder and CEO of Kaleidoscope Affect LLC, a firm providing leadership development, management consulting, and strategic advisory services.

Before her current role, Dr. Singh made significant contributions as the inaugural Leader-In-Residence at Towson University, where she laid the groundwork for leadership culture and common leader competencies across the campus. Her career also includes tenure as the Interim Executive Director and CEO of TEDCO, an organization that provides

funding, resources and connections for early-stage technology and life sciences companies in Maryland.

Dr. Singh was appointed by Governor Larry Hogan in January 2015 to serve as the Adjutant General of the Maryland National Guard, which is comprised of Maryland's Air and Army National Guard forces. She is the first woman and first African American to ever hold this position in the State of Maryland. As the Commander, she was responsible for supporting the formulation, development and coordination of all programs, policies and plans affecting the Maryland Army National Guard, a force of over 4,600 soldiers. She retired in 2019.

Dr. Singh's corporate journey includes a remarkable 21-year stint at Accenture. Her board affiliations include positions with Westat, Capella University Board of Trustees, Strategic Education Inc., Tac (formerly MISI), and the Cybersecurity Forum Initiative. She has also served on the board of WaveDancer, Howard Bancorp, and is an emeritus member of Easterseals DC MD VA and Headstrong boards.

Dr. Singh holds a bachelor's degree in business, an MBA, a Master of Strategic Studies, and a Ph.D. in Industrial and Organizational Psychology. She has authored several books, "Moments of Choice: My Path to Leadership" and "What's in Your Box? Designing the Life You Want." Her professional certifications include Project Management Professional (PMP), Cyber AB Registered Practitioner Advanced (RPA), Professional Certified Coach (PCC), Certified Corporate Director, and Gallup Strengths Coach. She is also a certified John Maxwell trainer and speaker.

Honors and Recognitions

Honors

Consideration for honors for any Coppin undergraduate student (transfer or non-transfer) will be determined by the cumulative grade point average of all college work entered into the undergraduate's permanent academic record, regardless of where the work was pursued. Any student graduating with honors shall have earned not more than one grade of "D" or "F." Academic clemency for purposes of honors shall apply to students who have not attended any college or university for a period of ten years or more immediately prior to the current period of attendance at Coppin.

Latin Honors are determined as follows:

Summa Cum Laude – accumulative average of 3.75 or higher **Magna Cum Laude** – accumulative average of 3.50 to 3.74 **Cum Laude** – accumulative average of 3.25 to 3.49

Circulus Scholarum Society criterion for induction is:

Graduate Student -A student who has maintained a 3.8 average as a full-time student, enrolled in at least nine credits hours per semester.

Undergraduate -A student who has maintained a 3.50 average for six semesters as a full-time student, two semesters of which must be junior year.

Academic Regalia

The current practice of wearing caps and gowns has been handed down from the Middle Ages when scholars in the monasteries wore habits characteristic of their respective orders. Each order had its own style and colors.

The Bachelor's gown, which is worn closed, has long pointed sleeves. The Master's gown is made with openings in the sleeves near the elbow for the arms to come through. The Doctor's gown has full, bell-shaped sleeves with three horizontal bars stitched across the upper arm. The hood is long, full, rounded at the base and bordered with velvet.

The velvet color of the hood indicates the field of study in which the degree was granted.

The Coppin Mace

The Coppin mace, a heavy medieval war club with a spiked or flanged metal head, was used to crush armor. In England, when a high official was taking office or opening his court and needed a bodyguard, the mace, a formidable weapon, was held ready to protect the person of the dignitary.

From sixteenth-century England and colonial days in America, the mace, an ornamental staff, has become a symbol of authority and is carried immediately preceding the president in processionals, recessionals, and other official academic ceremonies. Though it is not used in all school ceremonies, the mace is particularly prevalent in academic ceremonies of older, more prestigious colleges and universities on the east coast of the United States.

The mace borne today was donated to Coppin State College by the Class of 1986.
